Walk and Bike to School Day events are a great way to evaluate the biking and walking conditions in your community. Use this checklist as a guide to determine what went well, what you will want to modify, and how you can expand your next event!

Did parents show up on time to the Walk and Bike to School Day event?				
Was there traffic around the school?				
Were the crossing guards notified about the event?				
Was it raining? Was there a contingency plan in place before the event?				
Were student bicyclists wearing their helmets and riding safely?				
Was the entire school and families notified or was it just the walkers?				
Were we thinking about all families and their participation?				
Were any kids (younger kids) walking or biking alone?				
Did we discuss with event coordinators about pairing kids with a family if they regularly walk or bike to school?				
Were local law enforcement agencies notified of the event?				
Was law enforcement present during the Walk and Bike to School Day?				
Were there broken sidewalks on your route?				
Were there working crosswalk signals?				
Did you have any conditions such as puddles at crossing locations?				
Were Crosswalk lines faded?				
Was street lighting okay for early events?				
Were drivers speeding?				
Were drivers blocking the bike lane?				
Were drivers (parents) dropping their kids off along the roadway to join an event?				
Did any student pedestrians or bicyclists come into close contact with drivers? If so, were there any reasons?
